#### **About Membership Payments**



Reservations can be made by phone or via the online reservation system. When making a reservation, you will be given the option to choose between the Pfizer, Moderna, or AstraZeneca brands. You will then be given the option to choose your preferred location from a list of medical institutions offering your chosen brand.
