Member Spotlight: Đinh Thị Hồng Hạnh





Đinh Thị Hồng Hạnh is from Hòa Bình City in Northern Vietnam. She was the first Editor for our Vietnamese Newsletter from August 2020. In mid-2021, she had her first child. Living overseas with no family or relatives around, and giving birth during COVID-19, she researched and took advantage of the maternity and post-partum services in Aizu. She hopes this information will help others in a similar situation; having and raising children away from home.

What kind of post-partum services did you use?

For the birth, I went to "Aizu Midwifery Group: Ohisama" in Inawashiro to use their Post-Partum Stay service. Usually, people just stay home for a week after giving birth, but without my parents or other relatives nearby, I got 24 hour support from the midwives at 'Ohisama.' Thanks to them, I was able to rest up, and got a lot of advice from them for my baby. After I went home, I used their visitation services. I was having trouble breastfeeding, so they gave me information about massaging, and medicine.

Then, I used the NPO Aizu Family Support services. They looked after my son, An, when I had doctor's appointments. They went on walks with me, and answered any questions I had when I was feeling anxious. When An was still in my tummy, I was worried about so many things, and didn't really have anyone to confide in. But after giving birth, with all of this support around me, I felt much better.

Where did you find info about them?

The hospital told me about 'Ohisama', and then Ohisama gave me information about 'Aizu Family Support.' Most other information, they gave me to help with loneliness while I was home looking after my child.

What are your thoughts now, having used these services?

I am so happy and grateful to have learned about and used these services in Japan. In Vietnam, there's only support from parents or relatives. Even now, when I went to get my drivers license, I was able to temporarily send An to a nearby pre-school. This

'temporary pre-school' service is also wonderful! I think Japan is easy to live in, with all this support for new parents trying to raise children without a support group.

Do you have a message for those who are pregnant, post-partum, or raising kids?

While you're pregnant, if you're feeling worried about something, ask a doctor about it. This is especially important for non-Japanese people because I think it can be hard to find information on your own. After giving birth, take full advantage of the childcare services. If you can lessen your stress, then both you and your child will be happier.

Also, I will never forget the first Aizu winter with my child. I remember those days when there was so much snow, I couldn't use a stroller and had to go for walks just holding An in my arms.

Finally, I want to express my thanks to all those people who helped me back then.

Aizu Family Support

Family Support connects members with vetted volunteers to help them with whatever they need to smooth the parenting process. Available for people with children aged 6 months - 12 years old. Services available for ~600-700yen/hr.

Example Services:

- Support for sudden illnesses and you can't take time off
- Pick-up/drop-off for when working overtime
- Daycare for:
- After school
- · Sibilings' school events
- Hospital visits etc.

Aizu Midwifery Group: **Ohisama**

Pregnancy, birth and post-partum support! Located in Inawashiro, near the Noguchi Hideo Museum, they're easily accessible from both Aizuwakamatsu and Koriyama. They opened in 2011 in response to the need for support for evacuated pregnant people and new parents.

Besides birth, they can help you with: Breastfeeding troubles, baby-care techniques, postpartum depression, exhaustion from child-care and more.

Through day services, overnight care, or scheduled visits, they will do their best to support you.
