




Aizu Bandaisan (Song) Spotlight

August and the Obon Holiday is the time for festivals and Bon-Odori (bon-dances.) People gather together wearing yukata, and dance. Performers play traditional flutes, taiko (drums) and other instruments. There are so many different varieties of song and dance at these summer festivals. In Aizu, typically 'Aizu Bandaisan' is sung while participants do the local dance. It can be difficult to understand what the singers are saving, so here are the lyrics!



Isasumi-jinja Shrine: Tanabata and Windchime Festival





Dates: 7/22 - 8/27 Shrine/Windchime Light-up: Sunset - 21:00

Isasumi-jinja is a large shrine in the middle of Aizu-Misato. It is an off-shoot shrine of the Ise-jingu in Mie. While Tanabata is celebrated at the beginning of July, traditionally, it was celebrated at the beginning of what is now August. Why take advantage of this and head over to write a wish and hang it on one of the many bamboo branches decorating the Isasumi-jinja this time of year? It's a beautiful sight to see the colourful wishes dangling off of the tall bamboo.

Tanabata Festival **8/7** ~18:00

You can watch the shrine staff put on traditional performances, such has dances, and music for this holiday. If you want to wear a yukata, they even have someone to help you put it on!

Windchime Market:

In addition to the large display, you can purchase your own windchime amulet! The ringing of windchimes is believed to dispel bad luck. The windchimes for sale are made by artists from around Aizu, including Kitakata and Misato.

If you stop by wearing yukata during the Tanabata/ Windchime Festival, you can get a small lantern for free! (While supplies last)
