

Tajima Gionsai

The largest festival in Minamiaizu! At night, local children perform kabuki on moving yatai floats, but the highlight is the Nanahokai Procession (Bride 'parade.') The Tajima Gionsai is one of the top Gionsai in Japan and attracts visitors and photographers from all over the country. Women dress up in traditional bride clothing and walk in a parade down the main street of Tajima, carrying

offerings to the shrine. All together, more than 100 people participate.

NIWA-san's Story

On June 8th, the new Office Manager NIWA Emi was the special speaker for our General Members' Meeting. Her speech was titled 'America, Africa, and now Aizu.' She talked about her experience going on exchange to Maine, USA, doing JICA in Senegal, and her time in Aizu. Here is an extremely abridged version: For a longer version, check the July edition of FINE (Japanese Newsletter)





When NIWA-san was a young child, her mother instilled within her the love of English. In her 3rd year at university, she decided to take the leap and go on exchange to America. While studying journalism, she made a lot of friends, increasing her communication skills immensely. She even had the

opportunity to meet famous author, Stephen King!

After returning to Japan and working in various jobs, NIWA -san saw a JICA recruit poster. Interested, she decided to take another leap. Signing up as a Youth Volunteer, she spent time

in Senegal and then as a staff all around Africa such as Niger, Djibouti, and Cameroon for over 10 years. Each place had different people, local languages, food and culture. While helping out with the local Girl/Boy Scouts, she introduced



Japanese crafts and games to school children, and also shared Japanese ways of thinking such as the importance of the 5S, ('sort', 'set in order', 'shine', 'standardize', and 'sustain', a workplace organization method that can be applied to life.)

In Senegal, she was hosted by the 'CISSE' family, earning her Senegalese name: Sophie CISSE. She came to love the food and fashion of the different places she lived. There is a saying in Africa that 'Once you drink African water, you will definitely return there', and for NIWA-san that holds true. Her second home is in Senegal.

Last year, she moved to Aizu for a job opportunity. While here, she's discovered a passion for bird-watching and Aizu's local products like lacquerware and Aizu cotton. She is touched by the warmth and kindness of the people of Aizu and is looking forward to more adventures here.
