

# MATSUYAMA Satomi, from the JICA Fukushima desk, visited the Association by highway bus from Fukushima City once a month. As a regional liaison officer for JICA (Japan International Cooperation Agency), she worked to raise awareness of the Overseas Cooperation Volunteer Programme and encourage participation in international cooperation. While visiting AWIA, she had many wonderful interactions with a wide range of our members. She has played a major role in linking the region and the world, through her efforts in connecting the international associations in the prefecture and helping to establish the Fukushima-Sri Lanka Friendship Association. From July, Matsuyama is retiring from the JICA Fukushima desk. As a farewell, she wrote about her memories of her three years at AWIA, which she called 'My Sweet Home'.

### **AWIA: My Sweet Home**





'The next stop is 'Shinmei Dori.' Please press the button if you are getting off the bus.'

This is the announcement that plays in the Highway bus from Fukushima City to AizuWakamatsu. I press the button faster than the other riders. I am excited, almost as if I'm a child returning to my family home.

Today is the Satellite JICA Desk Day. The day I work at AWIA. At the entrance of AWIA, a place with such a sense of freedom, I greet everyone with 'Ayubowan! (Hello in the Sinhala Language) Let's do our best today!' and in return, with a big smile, I'm told 'Welcome back Matsuyama-san!' It makes me both slightly embarrassed, and happy every time. Then, with a delicious cup of coffee prepared for me by the staff, I start my day. I'm often greeted by members with, "Oh, it's Matsuyama-san. It must be the JICA desk day." and then we would start exchanging information and chatting. For the past three years, I can't tell you how much I have been healed by this warm hospitality, enveloping kindness, and the fun interactions with the members. Yes, for me, AWIA is My Sweet Home.

Since I started the role of International Cooperation Promotion Officer of JICA Fukushima Desk in 2022, I have been

able to hold a "Satellite JICA Desk" every month. My job is to let as many people in the prefecture as possible know about JICA and the existence of the Fukushima JICA Desk. At first, it was a bit of trial and error, trying to figure out how to let the members to know about JICA, but when I saw people of different

2023 March, Sri Lanka Karuta As I participated in monthly events and actively promoted the Fukushima JICA desk and spread information from JICA, little by little "Matsuyama-san from JICA" became more and more widespread. In 2023 and

2024, we gathered high school students and held the 'International Seminar 'The World and Me' - Know, Think and Act. -High School Students' Workshop'. The students present-

ed what they had researched about the problems facing the world and engaged in activities to communicate their opinions and ideas through discussions. In addition, we organized lectures by a certified NPO in Yama-

gata and on SDGs by a lecturer from the Fukushima SDGs Network. The participating high school students became interested in SDGs and international cooperation, saw global issues as their own affairs, and were motivated to do what they could for the future. A JICA Overseas Cooperation Volunteers consultation desk was also set up for those interested in joining, where I introduced my activities and gave details of the application process. I feel that I was able to plant the seeds of interest for young people and push those who should become more involved to take the next step towards international cooperation.

I hope that many people will utilise the JICA Overseas Cooperation Volunteers system in the future and spread their

wings from AizuWakamatsu City to the world. I also hope through two years of activities in developing countries they will find treasures that cannot be found in Japan. And by sharing these treasures with Aizu Wakamatsu City, I hope that more people will be able to contribute to the realisation of a multicultural society.
