
- Perfect Award - beauty, perfection!

How to use:

(Interpretation available Mon-Fri 10:00-15:00)

1. Confirm that the clinic will allow telephone interpretation.

(If you cannot ask yourself, please consult AMDA.)

2. Make a doctor's appointment during the times available for your language.

3. Call and make reservation with AMDA for your clinic appointment time. (each session is up to 30mins)
